2. Netaji Subhash Mahavidyalaya: A Brief Profile

Netaji Subhash Mahavidyalaya is a conglomeration of approximately 3228 students, 55 regular and 22 Guest lecturers/teachers and 35 non-teaching staff. It was established by Government of Tripura on 21st September 1979 under Calcatta University and the journey began at Kirit Bikram Institution (KBI), a renowned Higher Secondary School at the heart of Udaipur town. Over the years, it has grown into an institution of modern learning. The catchment area of the college includes its adjacent agricultural and hilly region of the Gomati District and South Tripura District and neighbouring agricultural belt of the Sephahijala District. Although initially conceived merely to promote higher education among the local youth, its hinterland of student input

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has increased immensely during the last decade. Students today rush here to materialize their dreams with regard to choice of subjects in higher education from distant areas.

This new trend is because of the fact that the College is located adjacent to National Highway 44A. It is just near the river Gomati, the biggest river in Tripura and nearer to the Tripureshwari Temple. It is easily accessible by Bus, and Auto. Being only three kilometers journey from Udaipur Town and 48 kilometers from Agartala, the College is the first alternative to many students or any stakeholder opting for a college after any college located in Agartala. The immates of the college provide a unique outlook. Both Bengali and Kokborok speaking families send their wards to this college. Though the College has no aristocratic aura since most of the students are from middle and lower-middle class families, yet the matchless hospitalities thrill the occasional visitors.

Netaji Subhash Mahavidyalaya is the only institution of higher education in the Udaipur. Sub-Division. It is a co-educational day college located in rural area under the operational area of Matabani Rural Development Block. Initially the College was known as Udaipur Government Degree College. The college has been renamed as Netaji Subhash Mahavidyalaya (NSM) since 23^{ad} January 1997. It has been shifted to its present location in May 1986. The College was affiliated to Tripma University (T.U.) in 1987. The College received recognition from the University (T.U.) in 1987. 3.2 Restriction on the choice of Combinations

A student taking TDP (General), under B.A/B.Sc./B.Com. programmes, is required to take three elective subjects. For TDP (Honours) in a subject, a student is required to take two more elective subjects. There shall be compulsory Soft Study Courses and Soft Skill Courses in different Scinesters for all B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. programmes both in TDP(General) and TDP(Honours). The restrictions are:

- a) Subjects under Arts Group A cannot be taken with Science Group B. Best in a
- b) Psychology cannot be taken with Botany/Zoology.
- c) Either Bengall or English + any one is to be opted as elective subject in literature: amongo

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- d) Either Sanskrith or Kokhoroly any one is to be opted as elective subject.
- e) A student may choose Economics or Philosophy as elective subject.
- f) A student may choose Education or Physical Education as elective subject.
- g) A student who will choose Psychology cannot opt for Philosophy, History, Kokhorak and/or Sauskrit as elective subject.
- A student who will choose Geography cannot opt for Palitical Science/Sanskrit/Kekborek/History.
- i) Subject taken as Honours shall not be taken as one of the two more elective subjects.
- j) If a candidate desires to take Physics in TDP (General) as elective subject, he/she shall have to study Mathematics as one of the three elective subjects.
- k) If a candidate desires to take Honours in a subject under Column A, he/she shall have to take the subject mentioned under the correspondence Column - B as elective subject.

- 3.3 Eligibility for Admission
- 1. Any one passing the H.S.(+2) Examination of Tripura Board of Secondary Education or its equivalent shall be eligible for admission to the First Year Class of the Three Year Degree Programme (TDP) in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. General/Honours Courses.

2. For taking Honours in any subject

(a) A candidate must have obtained 40% marks in aggregate and 45% marks in the concerned subject or 35% in aggregate and 50% in the concerned subject at the H.S. (+2) or its equivalent Examination.

Selection of candidates in Honours courses is finalized by the college authority strictly according to merit. Merit means total marks obtained in H.S.(+2) by a student plus marks obtained in the concerned subject (Honours seeking subject).

- (b) Anyone, securing at least 50% marks in aggregate, shall be eligible for taking Honours in a subject which he/she did not study in H.S.(+2) Examination or its equivalent examination, subject to the restriction of combination as laid down in clause 3.2.
- (c) For taking Honours in B.Com course, a candidate must fulfill the condition as faid down here in above and (i) has secured at least 40% marks in Mathematics at Madhyamik or its equivalent examination or (ii) must have passed H.S.(+2) or equivalent examination with Mathematics or (iii) must have passed in 2 papers of Commerce at the H.S.(+2):
- 3. There shall not be any marks bar for ST/SC/PH category of students being admitted against the ST/SC/PH reserved seats/quota as required under point 2 (a), (b), (C) of clause 3.3 (Government of Tripura rules applicable for reservation of seats).

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- 4. A student shall not be allowed to take Honours in a subject in which he/she has failed in H.S.(+2) examination or its equivalent and subsequently passed as a compartmental candidate.
- 5. The candidates, who appeared but could not obtain pass marks in a particular subject and were declared successful through inter-change of any subject at the H.S.(+2) Examination or its equivalent, shall not be allowed to take up that subject in the degree course. However, if he/she subsequently passes in compartmental in that subject, he/she shall be eligible for taking such subject in the pass course.

6. All admission processes to First Semester classes shall be completed latest by 15th July of each academic year. In case of other semesters, provisional admission to subsequent semester classes be completed within 15 days from the date of completion of previous semester examination.

- 7. A student shall have to apply with 3 copies of recent Passport Size Photo for University Registration in the prescribed form within 30 days from the last date of admission. Once applied for registration, no request for change of subject is entertained.
- 8. A student shall be allowed to change a subject(s)/stream within 15 days from his/her admission to the College. No such change shall be entertained once applied to University registration.

9. No student shall be allowed to prosecute two full time courses simultaneously.

Note: Students passed H.S.(+2) examination or its equivalent in 2015 would be preferred first where there is seat restrictions and be given top priority followed by 2014.

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3.4 Instructions to Candidates for Admission to B.A./B. Sc./B. Com. (General And Honours)

Along with the application form dully filled in, the candidates are required to submit the self attested photo copies (one copy each) of the following documents:

- 1. Madhyamik Admit Card
- 2. Madhyamik Mark Sheet
- 3. H. S. (+2 Stage) Mark Sheet
- Caste certificate for ST/SC students (essential for availing any quota)
- 5. P.R.C. /P.R.T.C./ C.R.C.
- 6. School Leaving Certificate (original to be submitted at the time of admission)
- 7. Employer's No Objection Certificate for employees
- 8. 5 (Five) copies of recent photographs (1 copy passport size photograph on the application form, 3 copies passport size photographs and 1 copy stamp size at the time of admission).

All certificates in original are to be produced during the time of submission of forms as well as at the time of admission for verification.

Incomplete applications in any form or without the necessary documents as mentioned above shall be rejected.

3.5 Medium of Instruction

The deliberations in the classrooms may be conducted both in Bengali and English medium as per need. The candidates shall have the option for writing either in Bengali or English in Examinations conducted by the College as well as the Tripura (Central) University.

5. Academic Guidelines

- 1. A student must wear college-uniform from the date of commencement of classes.
- 2. A student must wear his/her identity card.
- 3. The name of the students, who will keep himself /herself absent from the college for one month continuously, may be struck off the attendance register.

6. SYLLABI, CURRICULUM, ATTENDANCE AND EXAMINATION

All syllabi, curriculum, attendance in classes and periodical examinations will be strictly as per rules and regulations of the Tripura University to which the college is affiliated. The name of the students, who will keep himself absent from the college for one month continuously, may be struck off the attendance register. The students below 75% attendance may not be allowed for final examinations.

7. National Service Scheme (NSS)

National Service Scheme (NSS) is one of the great schemes of the National benign government. It encourages being responsive to the call of the society, to be sensitive to the issues of the nation, ignites a sense of patriotism within NSS Volunteer. Moreover, members of the NSS family are punctual, polite, sincere, discipline and reliable. So the college encourages the students to join NSS and serve the nation building process. For detailed information in this regard, the interested students of the college are advised to contact with the NSS Programme Officer of the College. At present, Ms. Archana Dandapath, Assistant Professor, Department of Bengali is the programme officer. The college also has a *Red Ribbon Club* that works under the NSS of the college unit in collaboration with the Tripura State Aids Control Society. The objective of this Club is to create awareness among the youths in particular and the masses in general about AIDS-HIV disease and to help it prevent from spreading.

8. National Cadet Corps (NCC)

National Cadet Corps is also another youth organization of volunteers of Government of India with a glorious past of more than 63 years. Like the brethren organization of the NSS, the NCC is also a world famous for its refined moral values and patriotism. Therefore, the college encourages the students to join the NCC and serve the nation. For detailed information in this regard too, the aspirant students are advised to contact with the NCC programme officer of the College. At present, Ms. Ananya Sinha is the programme officer of the female wing and Dr. Samir Kumar Diabagh is of the male wing.

9. Library

The college maintains a library with well stock of books, which cater to the needs of good number of students. The library has reading room facility, computer with internet connection facility. The library activities and overall library development activities are being supervised by a library committee.

10. Discipline

Discipline is one of the very important yardsticks by which an academic institution is measured and evaluated. The college expects good manners, sanctity, discipline and befitting decorum from students in and outside the college. Any student, who violates these sacred values and indulges in anti social, destructive and undesirable activities, is liable to punishment. The sanctity of the college is to be maintained at any cost. With a view to maintaining proper discipline and combating any form of ragging inside the college, a discipline cum an anti-ragging committee keeps vigil and makes round o' clock duty.

11. Dress Code

Like other general degree colleges of Tripura, this college also maintains a separate dress code for the students. The students are required to follow strictly the prescribed dress code and attend the classes wearing the specified college uniform only. For boys, it is navy blue coloured trousers and full sleeve sea green shirt and for girl students, it is ash-coloured kameeze with sky blue salwar and sky blue do-patta.

12. Distance Education Centre

Tripura University (A Central University) opened and runs a Distance Education Centre in the college with the objective of providing scope for higher education to the drop out students and service holders. For necessary assistance and information in this regard, students may contact Dr. Nurul Islam, the present Co-coordinator of the college unit Centre on all Saturday (after 3 P.M.) and Sundays.

13. Hostel Accommodation

The college maintains and runs a boarding hostel for the ST boy students with fifty seats capacity. Generally students coming from long distant and hinterland areas with BPL/Low Income background are given top priority at the time of selection of ST students for hostel accommodation. After admission, such students are required to apply for hostel accommodation through the prescribed application form (available in the college) along with attested photo copies of some important documents such as Ration Card, Family Income Certificate from Deputy Collector and Magistrate (DCM), and Distance Certificate from Sub-divisional Magistrate (SDM). For further information, hostel aspirants of ST category students can contact the Hostel Superintendent. At present, Sri Rupak Das, Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce is the Hostel Superintendent.

14. Teachers' council

Teachers' Council is formed with all teachers of the college reflecting on the principles of participation in decision-making process in a democratic environment. All regular teachers of the college are members of the council. Principal of the college is the Ex-officio President of the council. The council elects the office bearers and forms other important committees in the annual general meeting of the council for smooth conduct of its academic and non-academic activities. At present, Dr. Parthasarathi Debroy, Assistant Professor, Department of Human Physiology is the Secretary of the Council.

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15. Students' Union Council

It is an elected body of the students and it looks after the academic and welfare aspects of the students by creating a link between the college management and the students. The Principal of the College is the President of the Council and the Vice President and other Secretaries/Members of the Council are elected representatives of the students from amongst them. At present, Sri Mamoon Sarkar is the Vice-President and Sri Gouranga Barman is the General Secretary of the Council.

16. Right to information (RTI) Cell

The Right to Information Act was enacted in 2005. The objective of the Act is to ensure and promote transparency and accountability in the working of government institutions. It mandates timely response to the requests of citizen/stakeholders for government information. The Act emphasizes on 'proactive disclosure' so as to minimize the queries or request for access to information. The RTI Cell is opened at Netaji Subhash Mahavidyalaya with the following officers:

17. Administration

Being a government college, the whole administration is run following rules and regulations policy and decisions adopted by Government of Tripura from time to time. Overall management and administration of the college is under the direct control and supervision of the Directorate of Higher Education, Government of Tripura. At the College level, the Principal is academic and administrative head and everything is under the supervision and control of the Principal, who is accountable to the Directorate of Higher Education. He is assisted by various sub-committees headed by a convener as and when required.
