# INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL Netaji Subhash Mahavidyalaya, Udaipur, Gomati, Tripura ONLINE TEACHER EVALUATION FORM (STUDENT FEEDBACK) ANALYSIS REPORT (For Academic Year 2021-22)

In the academic year 2021-22 Online Teacher Evaluation (Student Feedback) was taken from the students of all departments through Google forms during the period of **19**<sup>th</sup> **June, 2022 to 10**<sup>th</sup> **July 2022**. The google form link for a particular department was shared by the HOD in both Major and General student social networking groups of the department for the purpose. Feedback was collected on uniform parameters for both regular and guest faculty members.

The parameters on which students have given feedback on their teachers are-

- 1. Ability of the teacher to get the attention of the class
- 2. Clear and systematically done presentation of the subject matter
- 3. Arousal of students' interest and encouragement given to them for participation in discussion during class
- 4. Writing on Board, Figures/Diagrams (Visual aids)
- 5. Use of ICT tools (PowerPoint, Smart TVs etc.) for effective teaching
- 6. Use of information of current events, recent discoveries and views related to the topic in teaching
- 7. Maintenance of Proper pace of teaching
- 8. Regularity and punctuality in conduct of classes
- 9. Answering Questions raised by students
- 10. Guidance given outside the classroom
- 11. Efforts regarding online teaching

For giving feedback students had to evaluate a particular teacher with respect to each of the above parameters on a 5 point scale where 1 = Unsatisfactory, 2=Fair, 3=Satisfactory, 4=Very Good, and5=Excellent. During the analysis of the feedback every case where more than 25% of the total respondents have given less than satisfactory i.e., "1= Unsatisfactory" or "2=Fair" as feedback for a particular faculty member against a particular parameter has been pointed out.






1. Your present job responsibilities as a college teacher 37 responses




2. Culture in your college in terms of promotion of your flexibility as a teacher <sup>37 responses</sup>




# 3. Your freedom over the instructional methods which you use to teach a particular subject 37 responses



# 4. Your freedom in deciding the assessment methods/ parameters of your students <sup>37</sup> responses




# 5. Leadership style of your institutional head 37 responses
















11. Division of academic/ administrative workload among the teachers in the institution (Division of Class load, copy checking, invigilation, membership in different committees etc.)




### 12. Your representation in institution decision-making process




# 13. Library facility of the institution in terms of infrastructure, availability of journals and latest edition books




# 14. Research Ecosystem of the institution in terms of academic, administrative and infrastructural support




# 15. ICT infrastructure of the institution in terms of availability of modern teaching tools, computers and internet connectivity


